A small guide to elevating your Du'as

- **Observing wudhu before making** 1 the Du'a (it's sunnah, not obligatory).
- Facing the Qiblah (it's sunnah, not obligatory). 2
- Raising one's hands towards Allah 3 as a gesture of supplication.
- Sending blessings upon the Prophet (PBUH) at the open and close of your Du'a.
- Using Allah's beautiful names to invoke 5 Him during Du'a.
- Seeking repentance and forgiveness 6 for sins and wrongdoings.

Sincerity and unwavering trust in Allah's (swt) response.


Du'a for divine guidance

Du'a for acceptance




Rabbana taqabbal minna, innaka antas-Sami'ul-'Aleem.

The following is a special Du'a to recite on the Day of Arafah*



Lailaha illalahu wahadahu lasharikalahu lahulmulku walahu hamdu wahuwa alakulli shayin kadir

There is no God but Allah alone Who

has no partner, to whom dominion belongs, to whom praise is due, and who has power over everything.

* The best time to make Dua is during the last hour before Maghrib prayer

Du'a to recite on Eid al Adha* الله أكبر، الله أكبر، لا إله إلا الله، والله أكبر الله أكبر ولله الحمد

Allah is the greatest, Allah is the greatest. There is no deity besides Allah and Allah is the greatest. Allah is the greatest and all praises

are for Allah only.

* It is highly recommended for every Muslim adult to recite the Takbeer-e-Tashreeq after prayer from the 9th-13th Dhul Hijjah. Men should recite this out loud, while women should recite this silently. There is no day on which Allah frees people from the Fire more so than on the day of 'Arafah. He comes close to those (people standing on 'Arafah), and then He reveals before His Angels saying, 'What are these people seeking.
